#### FROM THE PASTOR

Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Happy Mother's Day! Thank you to all mothers for fulfilling the most important role in the world, being a mother, even if it is as a spiritual mother! May you be rewarded well in heaven. The month of May is also the month of our greatest spiritual mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. May we honor her and go to her often for her intercession.

You will see in the most recent issue of *The Catholic Times*, Fr. Paul Keller's article on dressing well for Mass. It is well-written and I encourage everyone to read it. I think it is encouraging to see many young women dressing modestly at Mass. It is also encouraging to see young men wearing a suit and tie to Mass. I thank you all for that. Imagine if not only the adults, but kids dressed up in a suit or a dress. This might enhance their enjoyment of coming to Mass recognizing they are going to something special.

One of the objections that people sometimes give when we address dressing well for Mass is that the only thing that should matter is that they are there at Mass. Fr. Keller answers that objection in his article, essentially saying that God sees and cares about the heart, more than their external appearance, but the external appearance can also reflect the heart. Think of how we might dress for a wedding banquet. It is primarily for the sake of the wedding couple that we would dress well. To not dress well reflects a disrespect of the wedding couple. Jesus tells the parable of everybody who is invited to the king's wedding banquet, but one man shows up improperly dressed. Everyone is invited, but not all respond in the proper manner. The offended king asks how this man did not think to dress up and orders his servants to throw out the man. It was not so much about his clothes, but rather his disrespect of the king in not dressing properly.

The US Bishops say that "We should also come to the sacred liturgy appropriately dressed. As Christians, we should dress in a modest manner, wearing clothes that reflect our reverence for God and that manifest our respect for the dignity of the liturgy and for one another." Thank you to those who lead the way by doing so. Fr. Paul Keller suggests the phrase "our Sunday best" can have meaning again, not that we dress in a way that is gaudy or flashy, but that we dress to give utmost respect to God whom we worship. On a final note, if we do see somebody dressed immodestly or shabbily, we should not scorn them. For some, that could be the best they have. For others, they may not know better. We should always be kind, compassionate, patient, and charitable when correcting others (even when it's time to turn over a few tables!).

In addition to thinking about our heart for God in how we dress, we should think about our heart for God when we receive Communion. We believe in the profound mystery that in the Eucharist, we are receiving Jesus, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. We have God inside of us and He is transforming us. It is such a profound mystery that we need time to meditate on it and to thank our Lord. It is not a time to walk out the door immediately after receiving Communion. Some might think that the Mass feels too long, but therein lies the sacrifice. The Lord Jesus sacrificed Himself on the Cross for us, can we not make an offer of sacrifice for Him? It is good to reflect upon how much we appreciate the Lord Jesus who we have just received in the Eucharist. Our actions signify our beliefs. How will we be judged if we signify that we did not much respect God? In a humorous way, I'll say it like this: Judas, who betrayed Jesus, was the first to leave Mass early (at the Last Supper), immediately after receiving the morsel. After we receive Communion, the Mass is not yet over, so unless there is a valid reason for needing to leave early, let's not be like Judas!
