FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings in the Lord, Jesus Christ!

Someone recently apologized to me for wearing shorts to Mass (apparently, he read my Pastor's Note!), but he had a cast on so it was easier for him to put on shorts. Of course, he had a good reason to wear shorts. What I had written was for people to reflect in their hearts about their attitude towards God, not about mandating what people should or should not do. The Scriptures continually teach us that what God wants is a change of heart – from God saying to the Prophet Ezekiel, "I will give them a new heart and a new spirit" to Jesus saying that only external actions are not enough, but rather a change of heart is necessary, "Everyone who looks with lust has already committed adultery in his heart."

So, there may be extenuating circumstances why someone wears shorts to Mass. They might be running errands with shorts on and they spontaneously decide to come into church to pray and attend a weekday Mass. There could be extenuating circumstances why someone might be late for Mass such as being stopped by a train, or just getting off work, or having a family member throwing a temper tantrum before Mass (children included!). It is good though to have a deeper reflection on if our external behavior is a manifestation of something deeper in our hearts and attitudes towards God that may need to change. And then pray with Psalm 51, "Create a clean heart in me, O God."

As Fr. Keller goes on his way, I will miss him. He has been a good friend and co-worker in the vineyard. We give thanks to God for his presence and his ministry to our parishes.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. KELLER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord Jesus,

This is Fr. Keller. As I write to you today, as I prepare to leave Sacred Hearts and St. Mary's, I have on my mind the beginning of St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (1:3-11), which has been a passage very dear to me for many years. It expresses, better than I could with my own words, how I feel as I finish my time here. Paul says to the Philippians:

I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right that I should think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, you who are all partners with me in grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

As I finish my time here, I wish to thank all of you for your continued prayers and for the kindness you have shown me. Like Paul, I am filled with joy and give thanks to God for you and for the privilege it has been to be with you these last two years. I have received so many blessings from God in my time here. Your support, encouragement, and prayers have helped me immensely in my priestly ministry. Like St. Paul, I want to remind you that we are all "partners" in grace. We have all been given Divine life through Christ and that is the greatest gift we have received. A thousand lifetimes would be too little time to thank God for what He has done for us. But what we can do is surrender ourselves completely to Christ from now on, so that our "love may increase ever more and more" each day. Part of this surrender to Christ entails an obligation to proclaim the Gospel in our communities, wherever we are. You all are the presence of Christ and His Church to your workplaces, neighborhoods, schools, family, and friends. The more we love Our Lord the more we will proclaim Him. My prayer is that our communities in Marion and Morrow counties will experience an abundance of grace, that many fallen-away Catholics would return to the faith and that those who have not known Christ and His Church would find Him. Finally, I pray He will bring to completion the work of His grace begun in each of you until He comes again in glory. This is my prayer as I head to Rome. Please remember me in your prayers as well. Although in one way this is "farewell," yet in a far deeper way we are always united through the Church, especially in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. May the Lord bless you all and may the Virgin Mary protect you.
