FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings in the Lord Jesus Christ! This Sunday, September 29th is World Day of Migrants and Refugees. You will notice in the bulletin a letter signed by all of the bishops in Ohio regarding the plight of migrants and how we should "welcome the stranger" as Jesus says in Matthew 25 and shelter the homeless as one of the corporal works of mercy. The bishops speak of migrants as neighbors who we must love. They also speak of the dignity of the human person which must be protected since all people are made in the image and likeness of God. That is the lens with which we must view all peoples, migrants, as well as those born and unborn. If we are tempted to think of migrants as a people who are unwelcome, we must remember that many of our own ancestors were migrants to this nation, fleeing dire conditions in their home countries, whether due to famine, wars, or religious persecution; whether Irish, German, Italian, Polish, or Asian. Most migrants are coming as families with children who are fleeing violence in their home countries or who are looking for work. We must love them and welcome them, even if it is a burden.

I am currently reading a book written in 1907 by Robert Hugh Benson, called Lord of the World. In this book, the world wants to make humanity better by eliminating suffering. The problem is that suffering will always be with us. Jesus himself said, "The poor you will always have with you." We can work to make humanity better, but never by focusing on trying to eliminate all suffering. Jesus said to carry our cross daily. This means suffering is the normal way of life, not every second of the day, but as a regular occurrence. Therefore, when it comes to migrants, we must accept the cross of helping them rather than making it easier on ourselves with the attitude of "send them back." If we "deport them all," then we are simply trying to eliminate our own suffering, but the migrants end up suffering worse. As a common humanity, we must not be selfish, but must rather think of our brothers and sisters.

Since I am speaking of a hot-button political issue, I must speak as well on the issue of abortion under the guise of reproductive freedom." If abortion is the intentional killing of an unborn child, then we must not say that people should be "free" to make that decision. We cannot say "My choice, my body," since it is a separate body, another separate human being in the womb. Those who advocate for the freedom of abortion perhaps desire to eliminate the suffering of the pregnant mother who does not want the child. That is admirable except it seeks to make humanity better by eliminating suffering at all costs. Yet, suffering will only increase. The ones who will suffer the most are the unborn children. We, too, as a people will suffer from this choice as our own humanity will be greatly diminished. Suffering will never be eliminated if we refuse to carry the cross. The solution is that we must carry the cross of helping those women in need. Pro-life pregnancy centers are helping those mothers to care for their children they thought they shouldn't have. Imagine if those who advocate for abortion also helped carry that cross rather than advocating for the elimination of suffering. When we help each other to carry our crosses, our humanity grows and we find greater joy, fulfillment, love, and hope. We are more united to God because we have loved our neighbor.




