FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings in the Lord, Jesus Christ! This weekend's Gospel reading tells us of Jesus healing a deaf and mute man by sticking His finger into the man's ear and spitting on His other hand and touching the man's tongue. He says, "Be opened," and the man's ears are opened and his speech impediment removed. The image is of Jesus being an electrical conduit, plugging Himself into the man. While Jesus heals people in different ways, this particular imagery suggests for Jesus to be plugged into us. He is the giver and we are the receiver and thus, His divine power flows into us. It is also the reason why the Eucharist is so powerful because in that way, we receive Jesus within us and He transforms us from within.

I've had a few inquiries recently about a couple of things: what does the congregation do with their hands during the *Our Father* at Mass and what is going on with certain little children receiving communion?

For the Our Father, some were confused because they specifically remember the U.S. Bishops about 20 years ago telling the congregation to raise their hands during the Our Father (and in many cases, the practice goes back decades earlier). Individual bishops, however, can make their own rules to govern their dioceses. Fr. Paul Keller, who is the Director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Diocese of Columbus, wrote about the Our Father posture in The Catholic Times (our Diocesan newspaper) in the July 18, 2023 edition explaining the theological reason for the proper posture. Fr. Paul Keller's role is to regulate how we worship at Mass and other liturgies. He was hired by Bishop Earl Fernandes (our bishop), so whatever he says is essentially a directive from the Bishop. In short, he says that the priest raises his hands during the Our Father in the "orans" posture, the praying posture, as the one who is ultimately beseeching God on behalf of the congregation. The congregation does not raise their hands. Hopefully, this clears up the confusion.

Regarding little children receiving communion: Some children have been baptized in the Eastern rite where they receive Baptism and the Eucharist immediately as infants. The Eastern rite (not to be confused with Eastern Orthodox) is in communion with the Pope in Rome and they are allowed to continue their practice, even if attending a Roman Rite Catholic Mass, such as our own. There are 23 Eastern rite churches that are in communion with Rome, recognizing the authority of the Pope, but may differ in spiritual practices. Some examples of Eastern rite Catholic churches are the Byzantines, the Maronites, and the Melkites.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) is for those adults who want to learn about the Catholic religion and possibly to become Catholic at Easter. Weekly classes will begin on Tuesday, September 24th at Sacred Hearts and Wednesday, September 25th at St. Mary, Marion, after the 6:00 p.m. Masses, so from 6:45-8:00 p.m. If you know of anybody who would like to become Catholic, please invite them to consider joining in on the classes and to contact the office to register.


